The key is to read and add one piece to the decoration chain each day. As your chain gets longer you will know that you are getting closer to Christmas. Friday, December 1

Advent is the season leading up to Christmas. Advent means "coming." This Sunday you will see an Advent Wreath at the front of the church. You may even have one at home. Each week we will light another candle. Christmas is coming. It reminds us that Jesus came for us to be our Savior! On Christmas Eve and Christmas Day we will light the white, center candle which is often called the "Christ Candle."



Wednesday, December 6

Gifts are often what a lot of people think about when they think of Christmas. People are busy shopping and you may even have something in mind you hope to get this year. God has given you an amazing gift. He didn't put it under the tree. Instead, it was placed in a manger. God gave you His Son. He has given you forgiveness of sins and eternal life. As St. Paul says, "Thanks be to God for his indescribable gift!" (2 Corinthians 9:15 NIV).



Monday, December 11

Did you know that the practice of bringing a Christmas tree into the house has often been credited to Martin Luther? The color of green reminds us of the new life that Jesus came to bring us. Think about how a Christmas tree points up to heaven. We often put presents under the tree. James reminds us, "Every good and perfect gift is from above, coming down from the Father of the heavenly lights" (James 1:17 NIV). Jesus, our Savior, is the best Christmas gift of all.
